Steps to becoming a PAWS Volunteer (not necessarily in this order):

- 1. Become familiar with the Summary Document
- 2. Mail the completed Observation Form to Frazer
- 3. Successfully complete the Temperament Testing with your animal
- 4. Then, Pray & Visit!

Additional Notes

- The observation is a process to help you think about what's happening; what works well and how you would handle a similar situation.
- Some visits are in a group setting and other visits are strolling along hallways and entering rooms. Entering a room always requires asking permission and common sense related to the immediate situation with the resident.
- During the Temperament Testing, you might have been told that your animal had limitations associated with other animals or people. See if you recognize other animals being utilized along with some limitation.
- Remember, Montgomery Children's Specialty (formerly Father Walter Children's Home) require that a copy of the Rabies Vaccination Certificate be on file. You may send it in advance or take it with you on your first visit. You may also want to keep a copy with you in case they need to verify compliance.
- If you are ever the only PAWS representative ask to meet with a staff person. This will usually be an Activity Coordinator. Introduce yourself and explain you are from Frazer and you are with the "PAWS" program. Ask them to explain the normal process when PAWS visitors are there. Discuss the program with them and ask how you can have the greatest impact during your visits.
