WHAT IF?

Week 2-- What if I had the conviction to live different from the world?

“The fundamental fact of existence is that this trust in God, this faith, is the firm foundation under everything that makes life worth living. It’s our handle on what we can’t see. The act of faith is what distinguished our ancestors, set them above the crowd.” Hebrews 11:1-2 (Message)

- **Conviction to live different comes from a relationship with God.**

The Lord observed the extent of human wickedness on the earth, and he saw that everything they thought or imagined was consistently and totally evil. So the Lord was sorry he had ever made them and put them on the earth. It broke his heart. And the Lord said, “I will wipe this human race I have created from the face of the earth. Yes, and I will destroy every living thing—all the people, the large animals, the small animals that scurry along the ground, and even the birds of the sky. I am sorry I ever made them.” But Noah found favor with the Lord.” Noah was a righteous man, the only blameless person living on earth at the time, and he walked in close fellowship with God.” Genesis 6:5-9 (NLT)

- **Conviction to live different is about obedience to God.**

“...So Noah did everything exactly as God had commanded him.” Genesis 6:22 (NLT)

“It was by faith that Noah built a large boat to save his family from the flood. He obeyed God, who warned him about things that had never happened before. By his faith Noah condemned the rest of the world, and he received the righteousness that comes by faith.” Hebrews 11:7 (NLT)

- **What if we had the same conviction as Noah?**

“This is love for God: to keep his commands. And his commands are not burdensome, for everyone born of God overcomes the world.” 1 John 5:3-4a (NIV)
