• Boldly believe in God's power to do the miraculous.

Go Deeper:

- Read Romans 5:1-4. Are there any ways in which your character has been shaped for good by going through past sufferings? Have you had experiences that caused you to be more empathetic for the hurts of others?
- Read 2 Cor. 1:3-7. Have you known anyone who was able to take something bad that happened to them, and turn it into a way to help other people who are going through similar circumstances? How do you think it makes them feel?
- Sometimes past hurts open up our hearts more to other people, and sometimes they close us up and make us bitter.
 Which side do you tend to fall on? What are some things you think people can do to help stay open?
- Read 1 Peter 2:19-24. What is Jesus' example in suffering? How
 can going through suffering cause us to identify more closely
 with Jesus, and experience more of his love?
