### 4<sup>th</sup> and Long Week 2—Hail Mary

Numbers 11

#### 4th and long can tempt us into complaint and spiritual decline.

"The people of Israel began to complain: 'Oh, for some meat!' they exclaimed. 'We remember all the fish we used to eat for free in Egypt. And we had all the cucumbers, melons, leeks, onions, and garlic that we wanted. But now our appetites are gone, and day after day we have nothing to eat but this manna!" Number 11:4-6 NLT

"In everything you do, stay away from complaining and arguing, so that no one can speak a word of blame against you. You are to live clean, innocent lives as children of God in a dark world full of crooked and perverse people. Let your lives shine brightly before them. Hold tightly to the word of life..." Philippians 2:14-16a NLT

Life is full of unwanted circumstances. It is our response to those circumstances that will determine whether our journey will result in lasting growth or a destroyed spirit.

## 4<sup>th</sup> and long is an opportunity to see God's <u>provision</u> and experience <u>spiritual growth</u>.

"But Moses said, 'There are 600,000 foot soldiers here with me, and yet you promise them meat for a whole month! Even if we butchered all our folks and herds, would that satisfy them? Even if we caught all the fish in the sea, would that be enough?' Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Is there any limit to my power? Now you will see whether or not my word comes true!'" Numbers 11:21-23 NLT

"My brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of any kind, consider it nothing but joy, because you know that the testing of your faith produces endurance; and let endurance have its full effect, so that you may be mature and complete, lacking in nothing." James 1:2-4 NRSV

Remember in the dark what God has promised you in the light...

- Remember who God is and what He has done.
- Remember God's promises and His power to do the miraculous.

#### Go Deeper:

- Read Numbers 10-11. How do the events of the Israelites in the desert serve as a cautionary tale? What was the true nature of the Israelites' offense? How did it go beyond griping about manna and meat?
- Hardship is intended to build trust in God, but in the case of the Israelites, hardship resulted in complaint and unbelief. In what way might God be using hardship to build your trust in him? What is your usual response during difficult moments? How can you begin to choose trust and joy even when you're in a 4<sup>th</sup> and long?
- How is a 4<sup>th</sup> and long the perfect place for producing spiritual growth and life-altering faith?
- Which pattern would you say is more common for God's "team":
  A. Winning throughout the whole game or B. Coming from behind at the last second. Why do you think that is?
- What is hope? Why is hope important? What tempts you to give up on hope? What gives you hope?
- Memorize James 1:2-4 this week.
